Friday, January 1

Been quite warm all day.

Did considerable photo printing.

Went to Sapphire for the mail this afternoon.

There are forest fires in the mountains about.

Saturday, Jan. 2

Quite warm today and we had showers of rain. Had Mr. Dave Miller help me saw up some more wood this forenoon. Tried some photos of ourselves and tinkered the organ this afternoon. It is cooler and clearing off tonight.

Sunday, Jan. 3

Ther.: 12+, 22+, 18+

There was a very hard wind and it grew cold during last night. I had some fence to put up today. Dewey has a very hard cough. I called at Burlingames this evening. It has been clear all day, but is hazing up like a coming snow storm tonight.

Monday, Jan. 4

Ther.: 13+, 24+, 16+

It looked stormy this morning but cleared up by noon and is cold tonight. Spent most of the day in sawing wood having Mr. Miller help me. Dewey has seemed better today but still has a hard cough.

Tuesday, Jan. 5

Ther.: 13+, 32+, 20+

Real cold yet.

Sawed wood all the forenoon.

Did some printing of photos this afternoon.

Dewey much better of his cough.

Wednesday, Jan. 6

It has been a very nice day.

I went to Sapphire this forenoon to do errands and Kate went there to make calls this afternoon. I did considerable printing of photos and helped Mr. Miller saw up rail cuts.

Thursday, Jan. 7

Ther.: 32+, 44+, 34+

Been a moderate winter day. I finished a batch of photos.

Sensitized 50 postal cards tonight.

Friday, Jan. 8

Ther.: 32+

Heavy wind all today. I printed some postal cards and fixed up some of the photos made yesterday. We had callers from the hotel this afternoon. Went over to Sapphire for the mail this evening.

Saturday, Jan. 9

Been quite moderate all day.

I finished a large batch of photos today.

Had a letter from Will tonight. He is collecting taxes now, and is very busy.

Sunday, Jan. 10

It has been misty all day, so none of us have been off the place.

Wrote a number of letters and did some reading.

Monday, Jan. 11

Squalls of rain today, but considerable sunshine also.

Went over to Sapphire this afternoon.

Team brought over our groceries this morning.

Growing cooler tonight.

Tuesday, Jan. 12

Been raw, chilly and damp all day, and snow is falling tonight. I finished pruning my grape vines and also pruned Hiram's. Went over town again this afternoon.

Wednesday, Jan. 13

Ther.: 24+

The ground was white with snow this morning. I took my camera and went over into the Bohana settlement to try for a snow capped mountain view. I also tried a photo of an old grist mill. It snowed again some this afternoon and is pretty cold tonight.

Thursday, Jan. 14

Ther.: 12+, 24+

It was cold and wintry this morning. Split some wood and kept up fire this forenoon. Spent a good share of the afternoon at Sapphire showing views at the hotel.

Friday, Jan. 15

Ther.: 24+, 44+

It grew much warmer today. I went with Dave Miller to pace off some land we talk of setting out to apple trees next spring. We sawed wood up here this afternoon. Mr. Beaty called here this afternoon.

Saturday, Jan. 16

Quite warm all day and quite a shower of rain during middle of the day. I worked in the shop making Cyko prints and developing plates and films. Walked over to Sapphire this evening for the mail but Mr. Neely brought it while I was away.

It has cleared off tonight.

Sunday, Jan. 17

Ther.: 28+

Been a bright and pleasant day. We all took a walk over to the peach orchard this afternoon. All trees look well and we hope for lots of fruit next summer. Kate and Dewey called at Burlingames this forenoon and found Alfred sick. Ed Raines called here this afternoon.

Monday, Jan. 18

Very nice day. Helped Kate do the washing this forenoon. Did some photo printing.

Went over to Sapphire to mail letters this afternoon. Dewey has been playing out of doors most all day.

Tuesday, Jan. 19

Ther.: 18+, 34+

It was cold this morning and very chilly all day. Did some printing and made some Cyko prints this afternoon. It has turned warmer and it cloudy tonight. The folks made some molassess candy tonight.

Wednesday, Jan. 20

It has been a mild day and threatening to rain but the sun shone some during the middle of the day. I went to Sapphire this morning for oil and the mail. Finished a lot of photos this afternoon. Mr. Miller joined the new fence to the old today and will now go to repairing all the old.

Thursday, Jan. 21

Another mild day and coming on rainy tonight. I salted plain paper today. Went to Sapphire this afternoon to take mail, Kate sending off some leaves to friends.

Friday, Jan. 22

It rained hard during last night and showered a good deal all today. I continued salting my plain paper. We are getting more hens eggs now than for some time.

Saturday, Jan. 23

Ther.: 32+, 26+

Cooler today and growing cold tonight. Finished salting paper for this lot this morning. Went to Sapphire this afternoon for the mail. Mr. Dave Miller is still working on fence building for me.

Sunday, Jan. 24

Ther.: 18+, 36+, 30+

It was cold this morning. The wind blew hard all last night. We all stayed at home all day, which has been bright.

Monday, Jan. 25
Ther.: 26+

Milder today and been very pleasant. Mr. Miller and I cut the big poplar by the spring this morning and hae worked all day cutting it up. A couple of ladies from the hotel called here about noon. Alfred Miller brought me 3 bushells of corn this afternoon.

Tuesday, Jan. 26

We had quite a snow squall this forenoon but it was so warm it all melted. I wheeled up some wood and cut up a lot of kindling. Fixed up Mrs. Smith's album of views and took it to her this afternoon. It is growing colder tonight.

Wednesday, Jan. 27
Ther.: 18+

It was cold and clear this morning so I got ready and started for Highlands about 9 o'clock. I took dinner at Thomas Grimshawe's and got to Highlands about 6 o'clock this evening. I am stopping at the Central House. Called on Mr. Davis and The Bascom's this evening.

Thursday, Jan. 28

Was surprised when I got up this morning to find the ground white and snow falling fast. There was over 8 inches fall reported. I visited Prof. Harbison this forenoon and talked fruit growing. Called at Whites and Smiths this afternoon. It has turned to a mist and may rain or else turn cold by tomorrow. Settled with Russell, my view agent here this evening.

Friday, Jan. 29
Ther.: 18+

I left Highlands this morning and plowed through the snow all the way home. It was a tough walk. Found the folds all well. It is cold tonight, and I am glad I am home.

Saturday, Jan. 30
Ther.: 16+, 34+

Real cold this morning. Had to help Dewey start his sled sliding this morning, and he has been out playing most of the day. The Miller children came up to slide with him this afternoon. Had a letter from ma this evening, and it was very cold again up there.

Sunday, Jan. 31
Ther.: 18+, 40+, 32+

Moderated some today. We stayed very close to the house all day, reading and writing.

There was a little snow squall tonight, then it cleared off bright.

Monday, February 1
Ther.: 15+, 20+, 15+

It turned cold and very blustering this morning and has been the coldest day of this winter so far. Dave Miller and I sawed wood this forenoon. We burn lots of wood when it is so cold. I went to Sapphire this afternoon to mail letters. The wind went down and it is clear and beautiful tonight.

Tuesday, Feb. 2
Ther.: 25+, 40+, 34+

It turned warmer this morning and thawed the snow considerably. Tonight it is drizzling rain. Sawed wood most of the day. The children did more sliding down hill.

Wednesday, Feb. 3
Ther.: 22+, 40+, 30+

Pretty cold this morning again, but it has been pleasant all day and quite warm in the sun. I went to Sapphire this afternoon to get oil and mail letters. Found case of condensed milk at store and Mr. Burlingame hauled it home for me.

Thursday, Feb. 4
Ther.: 26+, 34+

Very pleasant day. I began work on "Photo Sketches", and ran off a batch of them. The snow melted considerable this afternoon.

The folks visited at Burlingames this afternoon.

Friday, Feb. 5
Ther.: 48+

Quite warm all day and thawing fast, snow gone on south slopes. Threatening rain this afternoon and tonight. I made another batch of "Photo Sketches". Mrs. Cheatham called here this afternoon. D. Miller did not come to work today.

Saturday, Feb. 6

Been cloudy, muggy and misty all day.

Went to Sapphire this afternoon to get the mail. Ed. Raines and the Dr. have just gotten a private telegraph line and I helped them practice a little. Had a surprise in getting a letter from cousin Alice Spoor Siver, of Owoso, Michigan.

Sunday, Feb. 7

Rained all last night and most of today. Read the papers and wrote letters.

It has quit raining this evening.

There was some sharp lightning and thunder this afternoon.

Monday, Feb. 8
Ther.: 38+

Been a mild and beautiful day.

I helped about the washing and then went at photo printing. Went over to Sapphire this afternoon to mail letters.

Tuesday, Feb. 9

Got up early this morning and walking over to Grimshawe's in Whiteside Cove, where I made some views and took dinner. Came back home this afternoon getting home just at dark. Am pretty tired. It looks some stormy tonight.

Wednesday, Feb. 10
Ther.: 26+

Rainy and misty all day, and freezing at the same time. Tonight it has turned quite cold. I developed my exposed plates and films this forenoon. Took a lot of views over to Sapphire this afternoon and did pretty well selling them.

Thursday, Feb. 11

Ther.: 24+, 32+, 32+

There was wonderful frost work on trees and bushes this morning and most of it stayed on all day. I tried making some photos of it. A Mr. and Mrs. Mellor called here this forenoon. Lizzie and Mable Burgess spent the day with Nellie. I finished a batch of platino prints. It has been foggy about all day.

Friday, Feb. 12

Ther.: 20+, 31+, 28+

Pretty cold this morning and chilly all day. Worked in the shop about all day fixing up negatives and making some Cyko prints. Went over to Sapphire tonight by lantern light. Daisy Burlingame was here at supper tonight.

Saturday, Feb. 13

Ther.: 18+, 34+, 25+

Been rather a raw, chilly day. I made up a batch of Photo Sketches. Nellie went over after the mail this afternoon.

Sunday, Feb. 14

Ther.: 42+

Been moderating and threatening to storm all day. It is raining gently tonight. I went with Dewey down to a place below our Glen where a prospect hole is being dug to find Corundum.

Monday, Feb. 15

Ther.: 26+, 28+

Right cool again today. Wrote letters did up photos to mail and spent time on getting ready for my Tryon trip.

Went over to Sapphire this afternoon.

Tuesday, Feb. 16

Ther.: 38+, 26+

It was pretty cold and some cloudy this forenoon. I had Dave Miller help me saw and get up wood and kindling today. Did more getting ready for trip to Tryon.

Wednesday, Feb. 17

Ther.: 22+, 34+, 26+

Raw day and looked like snow again. Mr. Dave Miller brought us a barrel of flour from the store this afternoon. Spent the day in choring about getting ready to go on my trip to Tryon.

Thursday, Feb. 18

Ther.: 22+

Left home this morning at daylight. Mr. Dave Miller brought me to the Lake Toxaway Station in his buggy. I left the folks all right, but I always dread leaving them alone at all. On reaching Tryon I hunted up Mr. Marshall's folks and am staying with them.

Friday, Feb. 19

It began raining during last night and showered a good share of today. This afternoon I took my camera and went out to Lynn and around Tryon some to try and get some views. Tonight the wind is blowing and it is turning cool.

Saturday, Feb. 20

I started this morning and footed out by Lynn to Columbus the county seat, and then up the Tryon Mountain to Skunkawakan Falls and up to the "Park" where I called on Mr. Ludlum and Mrs. Harris. We had dinner at the Log Cabin Inn and walked to scenic points on the mountain and then I came back by Skyuka. It was a long walk and not a good time for view taking.

Sunday, Feb. 21

It has been a stormy day. I wrote to ma and Kate and then posted them and walked out to the Connors, where I have spent a pleasant day and am staying all night. I fear there has been snow up home.

Monday, Feb. 22

A legal holliday but I worked hard all the same. Came back to town from Valhalla, got my camera and went to the waterfalls near Melrose. The wind blew very hard and bothered me greatly. The rain kept up till this morning.

Tuesday, Feb. 23

Very pleasant all day and I have made a number of exposures. Took dinner with Mr. Keenan and had a very nice time. Met some folks there from Vermont and their talk made me wish to see that country. Had letters from Kate and ma today.

Wednesday, Feb. 24

I did whole lots of walking and view taking today, going to the Mimosa Inn and Lynn. Made views at the Hossiry mill also. Came to Mr. Howes for supper and am staying at the Connors for the night.

Thursday, Feb. 25

Mr. Connor took me to the foot of Tryon Mountain this morning and then I footed it up the mountain to make views. The wind blew so hard I could do little that I wished to in the forenoon. I took dinner with Mrs. Harris and Mr. Ludlum. Came back to Mr. Conner's tonight by a new route down the mountain.

Friday, Feb. 26

Been cloudy all day. Mr. Conner took me over town this morning and I got the rest of my things. Took a number of photos about the Connor place.

Saturday, Feb. 27

Cloudy today also. I only made a couple of exposures. Went over town this afternoon. Had a letter from Kate. I am living too high here and must go back home soon as possible. It is misty tonight.

Sunday, Feb. 28

Cloudy most all day with a little sunshine toward night. I took dinner with Mr. Howes' folks today. Mr. Conner and I called at Mr. Morton's this forenoon. I have packed all things ready to start for Brevard tomorrow.

Monday, Feb. 29

Left Tryon this morning and started homeward. Got to Brevard tonight where I am stopping with Mrs. Jacobs. It was foggy early but cleared up and has grown warm.

Tuesday, March 1

Had to stay in Brevard all day so as to see Mr. Shipman tonight. I made a view of Mr. Black's new cottage and did a few errands at the stores. It has been warm and pleasant.

Wednesday, March 2

Left Brevard this morning and came to Lake Toxaway on the train. Took dinner at Emery Millers and then walked home this afternoon. I am glad to be at my own fireside again.

Thursday, March 3

Ther.: 29+

Been fussing about the shop and house all day. Dave Miller went to Lake Toxaway to get my things but failed to bring the most valuable box. It rained some and has turned some cold tonight.

Friday, March 4

Ther.: 22+

It was pretty well frozen up this morning. I did writing and then fixed up views to deliver at the hotel this afternoon. Settled all my bills at the office and feel better than I have for some time. It has been a pleasant day and is warmer.

Saturday, March 5

Ther.: 22+

Cold again this morning and raw all day. It clouded up this afternoon and tonight there is snow, sleet, and rain in the air. I finished a batch of photo sketches.

Had a letter from Will today.

Sunday, March 6

It rained during last night and all today. We have been nowhere and seen no one at all. Popped corn and ate, read and napped. It rains hard tonight.

Monday, March 7

Rained very hard last night, but cleared up this morning and has been a fine day. It is some cooler tonight. I went to Sapphire and got the plates I exposed at Tryon and have developed some of them tonight. There was no mail today as the train did not come up.

Tuesday, March 8

Did a lot more developing today and tonight. Mr. Smith made us a call this forenoon and I went with him and called on Mr. Neely. Nellie went to Sapphire and got the mail this afternoon.

Wednesday, March 9

Been working at negatives, and printing, all today. It had frozen some this morning, but was a warm and sunny day.

Kate and Dewey went to Sapphire this afternoon.

Thursday, March 10

It has been warm and pleasant today. I did a lot of printing. Went to Sapphire for oil and groceries this afternoon. Thunders tonight.

Friday, March 11

There was rain during last night.

It has been very pleasant today, but with a March wind blowing. It is decidedly cooler tonight and will freeze some. I finished a large lot of photos.

Saturday, March 12

It was a little frozen this morning and I looked for colder weather, but it turned warm and has been mild. Spent the forenoon in fixing up views to send away. Went to Sapphire this afternoon. Mr. Burlingame brought me a sack of fertilizer tonight, so we can go at planting.

Sunday, March 13

It showered very lightly at times this forenoon.

We all took a walk up on the orchard hill this afternoon.

I took a package of views over to the office to be taken to the express tomorrow and sent on to Tryon.

Monday, March 14

We had a heavy thunder storm during last night. It cleared up nicely this forenoon and has been a bright day, growing cooler tonight. Has Mr. Dave Miller at work today and we sawed up a good lot of fireplace wood. I went over to Sapphire this afternoon.

Tuesday, March 15

Ther.: 32+

It was freezing some this morning. Col. A.J. Smith came and we took a long walk down the valley south of here to an old corn mill and some falls. He took dinner with us when we got back and I went over town with him. It has been windy and cool all day.

Wednesday, March 16

Ther.: 24+

It was real cold this morning. Worked at wood sawing again. Kate, Dewey and Nellie had Mr. Miller's horse and buggy and went to do calling and trading at Sapphire.

It seems warmer tonight.

Thursday, March 17

Warmer today. I did some printing. Dave Miller dug up ground and I planted our early potatoes.

Did a lot of developing tonight.

It is raining some tonight.

Friday, March 18

It cleared up this morning and has been warm and pleasant all day. I wrote some letters and went to the office to post them this afternoon. We planted onions and sweet peas this afternoon. I finished developing Dr. Pratts films tonight.

Saturday, March 19

Another spring day.

I did a lot of photo Printing.

Nellie had a sort of girls party.

Got some more orders by mail for photos at Tryon and other places.

The trees I ordered for the orchard Dave Miller and I are going to plant came today.

Sunday, March 20

Warm and pleasant.

Read, wrote and slept most of the day.

It thunders and seems rainy tonight.

Monday, March 21

It only rained a little last night and we thought it was going to clear up today, but it set in the rain and has been a stormy day. I finished a lot of photos today.

Tuesday, March 22

Nice, warm day. I wrote letters and did up photos to send off by mail. I went over to Sapphire this afternoon. Col. Smith called and gave me an order for some views for a Mr. Daxter. I cut my wrist pretty badly in trimming trees.

Wednesday, March 23

Did some more tree trimming today between the frequent showers we have had. Col. Smith was here again today and brought me some money. Peach buds are almost bursting out and the apple buds are starting.

Thursday, March 24

No sunshine at all today, just mist and fog. I wrote out and fixed up the contract Dave Miller and I have entered on in planting an orchard on Rainy Knob. Went to Sapphire this afternoon. It rains softly tonight.

Friday, March 25

Rained all day.

I worked in the shop making "Cyko" prints.

This must be the equinoctial storm for this spring.

Saturday, March 26

Continues to storm but not heavily.

I went to Sapphire this afternoon for the mail.

Sunday, March 27

Cooler and clear today, but tonight it is clouding up and looks like a snow storm. It is almost freezing. Mr. Burlingame called and we looked over spray pump circulars. I have decided to send for a new pump.

Monday, March 28

Ther.: 28+

It was some frozen this morning, and I fear the peach buds will be hurt. I did a lot of printing. Went over to Sapphire and sent off an order for a spray outfit and poison to use of my orchard. It seems real cold tonight.

Tuesday, March 29

Ther.: 24+

Pretty cold this morning. I went hunting for a pheasant before breakfast but got no sight of him. Did a picture finishing business today. It looks like a gathering storm tonight.

Wednesday, March 30

Been cloudy and damp all day. I finished another lot of views today. The pheasants are eating our fruit buds badly.

Thursday, March 31

Did up views for mailing and took them to the office this afternoon. I got a letter and check from Mr. Missildrice. Hunted pheasants this evening but did not kill any.

It has been cloudy all day but cleared up tonight.

Friday, April 1

Kate's birthday.

I worked with Dave sawing and logging up in the clearing on the mountain. The wind has blown very hard. It appeared very rainy this forenoon, but all cleared away this afternoon. Kate planted garden peas this morning.

Saturday, April 2

Did a lot of Photo printing today. Dewey and Nellie went over to Dr. Cheatham's to an Easter party this afternoon. Had Dave Miller fixing up my grape vines today. It is growing cooler tonight.

Sunday, April 3

Ther.: 32+

It has been pretty chilly today and I fear a damaging freeze tonight.

We had Mr. and Mrs. Burlingame here for an Easter dinner. Little Dewey is suffering with both toothache and earache tonight.

Monday, April 4

Ther.: 26+

Pretty well frozen up this morning.

It has been cool all day but very pleasant.

I took photos over to the hotel this afternoon. I had the good luck to kill a pheasant tonight. His crop was full of buds and leaves from our peach trees.

Tuesday, April 5

Ther.: 28+

Rather cold this morning but it has warmed up today. It is very dry and there are forest fires out on the mountains. I did more printing today. Went to Sapphire after dinner. Kate had a letter from ma and Will was to go at work in Jackson yesterday.

Wednesday, April 6

A rainy day.

I finished 104 photo views.

Thursday, April 7

It did not rain today, but the sun did not shine much. I took some framed views over to Sapphire this afternoon and hung them in the hotel.

Friday, April 8

It rained very hard last night and showered some this forenoon.

I finished photos again today.

Found pheasants in the orchard again tonight but failed to kill any.

Saturday, April 9

Pretty clear all today but clouded up and grew chilly tonight.

Did a lot of photo printing today.

Went to Sapphire this afternoon to get the mail.

Sunday, April 10

Ther.: 32+, 32+

Been cold and disagreeable all day.

Walked over on the Rainy Knob orchards this afternoon with Dave Miller.

It looks hard for the fruit blossoms with all this cold.

Monday, April 11

It was growing warmer this morning but had frozen some during last night. I had to write several letters and do up photos to mail. Went over to Sapphire right after dinner. Pruned some apple trees this afternoon. It is quite warm tonight.

Tuesday, April 12

It was quite warm today but has grown much cooler tonight. I did a large job of photo finishing today.

Wednesday, April 13
Ther.: 29+

Cold again this morning.

Did up a lot of photos to send off and took them to the mail this afternoon.

Kate and Dewey went over and called on Mrs. Cheatham this afternoon.

Thursday, April 14

There was some ice this morning. Finished a batch of Photo Sketches. Went to Sapphire this afternoon.

Warmer tonight.

Friday, April 15

I sprayed the grape vines this morning, using my new pump which worked very nicely. Then I finished trimming the apple trees. This afternoon I had Dave help me fix about half of my road out to the gap. It thunders and showers a little tonight and is quite warm.

Saturday, April 16

We did a long planned job of cleaning and burning rubbish in the back yard this forenoon.

Went over to Sapphire this forenoon.

Had a letter from ma and Will has quit his job at Jackson and gone to work in Dexter.

It has turned real cool tonight.

Sunday, April 17
Ther.: 28+

Kate and I both have the sort of grip colds that are going the rounds.

We had callers from the hotel this forenoon.

It has been cold and squally.

I took a lot of photo views over to some people at the hotel who are going to leave tomorrow.

Monday, April 18

Did not feel well enough to work much today.

Went to Sapphire for the mail but there was nothing.

Tuesday, April 19

Did a lot of printing today.

We had a couple of callers from the Inn this forenoon. Nellie went over and got the mail.

Wednesday, April 20

Cool and cloudy all day with some snow flakes and then a drizzling rainstorm. I went over to Dr. Grimshaws this forenoon but he was away. Went to Sapphire after dinner to see Dr. Cheatham. He says I have got against some poison shrubs. It makes me suffer pretty badly.

Thursday, April 21

Been a bright, nice day but not warm as it should be at this season. I did more printing today.

Dave Miller began ploughing for my corn patch.

Friday, April 22

I finished a batch of 100 photos today. Mr. Miller completed the plowing for corn. Kate went over to Sapphire this afternoon.

Saturday, April 23

Kate and Dewey rode Dave Miller's horse over to Dr. Grimshaws this forenoon. He says my trouble is a sort of Eizema or itch. I did up photos and took over to the mail this afternoon. Had a check from Missildine in settlement to date. The weather is quite balmy. We sowed some more garden peas.

Sunday, April 24

Been a very nice day. Kate and Nellie attended preaching at Sapphire.

Arthur Miller called on me this evening.

Monday, April 25

Mr. Lamson, of The Lamson Studio, Portland, Maine, with Mr. Sargent of Castine, Maine, were here and I called on them at the hotel and looked over their colored work. I think I will put in a stock of that work soon. It is raining tonight.

Tuesday, April 26

It rained hard during last night. I went on a horseback trip with Col. Smith this forenoon. WE went through the Panthertown Laurel and on to Black Rock, and back by the Greenland forest and Mt. Toxaway. He took my in to the Inn for dinner.

Wednesday, April 27

Fussed about in the shop this forenoon. Went to Sapphire this afternoon for mail and groceries.

It is almost cold tonight.

Thursday, April 28

Made a batch of Photo Sketches today, but it was slow printing on account of clouds.

Mrs. Stolzenbach and her sister in law called here this afternoon.

Nellie went for the mail.

Friday, April 29

Cool and cloudy all day. I took a lot of photos over to the Sapphire Inn this afternoon and sold quite a lot.

Saturday, April 30

Warmer and quite pleasant all day. Made some photo-sketches.

Went over to Sapphire again this afternoon.

It has been a cold and backward April.

Sunday, May 1

Been a fine day.

Stayed quietly at home all day.

Kate has had a miserable toothache.

Monday, May 2

Thursday, May 5

Nice warm day. I finished a batch of plain paper prints. Had Dave Miller plant the field corn. Kate and I helped finish it toward night. Kate planted the pop corn, too. It sprinkled a little tonight.

Friday, May 6

Been a very beautiful day.

I finished a batch of 114 photo prints.

Saturday, May 7

Threatening rain all day and tonight. It is showering pretty hard. I went to Sapphire this forenoon to deliver photos.

Kate, Nellie and Dewey had Mr. Miller's horse and buggy and went to Sapphire this afternoon.

Sunday, May 8

Printed very hard all last night and this morning. Dr. Leslie Rideout and his bride came to dinner and are staying tonight. I took their horse and buggy over to Sapphire this evening.

Monday, May 9

This was Dewey's 6th birthday and we all went on a family picnic down to the Thompson River to the old grist mill. We took camera and kodaks to get little bits of scenery. It has been a fine day all around. It cooler tonight. The Dr. and bride left for Sapphire this morning.

Tuesday, May 10

I went to Sapphire with views this forenoon and sold quite a bunch. Had a call this afternoon from a Mr. Allen, of Cleveland, and I showed him about the place. It has been a fine day.

Wednesday, May 11

Did some wood hauling and hoeing in garden, beside printing a lot of photos. Had a call from a Mr. Russell of Philadelphia this afternoon.

Warm growing weather.

Thursday, May 12

Finished a batch of Photo Sketches. Helped Kate set some tomato plants up on the hill this afternoon.

Nellie went to Sapphire this afternoon and got the mail.

Friday, May 13

Sprayed the grape vines and a few of the trees this afternoon. Kate planted the melons. I finished a batch of photos. Fertilized some rose bushes and the Shaffer raspberries tonight. It is warm and looks a little stormy.

Saturday, May 14

Went over to Sapphire this morning to sell views. People are leaving so fast now that I will sell but few now. It showered some as I came home but cleared off nicely this afternoon and I took my camera and went up about Lake Fairfield after new views. It is cooler tonight.

Sunday, May 15

Ther.: 39+

It was very cool this morning and we feared a frost tonight but it seems to be growing warmer. In looking over the peach trees I find there are samples on most of them if they ever ripen. Ed Raines called a little while this afternoon.

Monday, May 16

Helped wash this forenoon and did up photos to mail and wrote letters. I went over to Sapphire this afternoon to mail the letters, etc.

Tuesday, May 17

We brushed up the garden peas and planted some more this morning. I took my camera and went to Fairfield for the day. It threatened to rain but has been a fine day.

Wednesday, May 18

Nellie and I went to Fairfield today and I made some 8 x 10 exposures on views. Yesterday and today made me pretty tired. We had a boat to go about on the lake with.

Thursday, May 19

It grew cool last night. We had callers from the Inn this forenoon. I sent 7 negatives to the Lamson Studio to try for colored work. Had a letter from ma and they had a snow storm last Sunday. Kate rode horseback over to Dr. Grimshawe's this morning. Dave began work again on fence building.

Friday, May 20

Pleasant day. It is getting very dry and our berries need rain. I finished a batch of photos today. Dewey is enjoying the luxury of going barefoot.

Saturday, May 21

Warmer but very dry. I worked around the cherry trees and some of the peach trees. Went to Sapphire just after dinner. We had a call from Mrs. Glazener, daughter and a cousin this afternoon. Watered a few things in the garden tonight.

Sunday, May 22

Have been at home reading and resting all day.

We took a look at the orchard to see how the fruit was coming on.

Nellie looks as though she were going to have the mumps.

Monday, May 23

Ther.: 82+

Nellie went to Mt. Toxaway with some of the Sapphire folks today. I sprayed all the apple trees that have young fruit on with Diaparene. It is getting dreadfully dry. Wheeled up some wood, watered some garden and began hoeing the popcorn.

Tuesday, May 24

Ther.: 80+

Continues hot and dry, though it thundered and threatened rain. I did a lot of printing this forenoon. This afternoon I fixed the trail up in the orchard and also hauled a lot of stone and put under the front porch. We continued watering the garden tonight.

Wednesday, May 25

Finished putting stone about base of chimney. Stored in pile of lath under the house so it will keep dry till we come back to the place in the future. I went over to Sapphire this afternoon. We planted more beans and sweet corn. Dry and hot.

Thursday, May 26

This forenoon I went to the Narrows and on down the river to the High falls making views. Got back home about 3 o'clock. Went over to Sapphire and Mr. Burlingame hauled a lot of groceries home for me. The threaten of rain seems to have passed away and a drouth in earnest set in.

Friday, May 27

We had strawberries for dinner and supper, the first of the season for us. I went up on Mt. Toxaway this afternoon to take photo views up for Mrs. Crisp to see. It was warm walking up. Seems cooler tonight. Dave plowed out the corn today.

Saturday, May 28

Did some photo printing this forenoon and also hoed some fruit trees. Went down to Lake Toxaway this afternoon to make views but conditions were not very good. I came home by moonlight tonight.

Dave hoed the corn. No rain.

Sunday, May 29

Still dry but threatening rain.

Thad Miller called here toward evening.

I read and wrote and rested.

Monday, May 30

We had a heavy rain last night and again this afternoon, so the dry weather is broken and we may have late strawberries. I finished 137 photo prints today.

Tuesday, May 31

We had a sharp shower this afternoon. I went over to Sapphire after dinner. Tried some exposures on Nellie toward evening.

It acts now as though it would rain too much.

Wednesday, June 1

We planted out some cabbage and cauliflower this morning. Have been working in the shop most of the day.

It has been cloudy and with a shower this afternoon.

Thursday, June 2

I went to the Whitewater Falls this morning and took several view photos. Came back by the Bohana school house and listed my property for taxes this year. Kate took up the carpet and cleaned the sitting room today. It has been warm and pleasant.

Friday, June 3

Had D. Miller hoe the vineyards and commence on the trees. I went down to Arthur Miller's and got a few rafters to put on the new porch when we build it. Did some printing this afternoon and went to Sapphire for the mail.

Pleasant and warm.

Saturday, June 4

Got up at 4 o'clock this morning and started for Lake Toxaway at 5. Hiram came on the train and we made some views on the lake. We had dinner at Mrs. Jacobs and walked back home this afternoon. It is pretty warm weather.

Sunday, June 5

Mr. and Mrs. Jacobs came and ate strawberry shortcake with us today noon and spent part of the day. It has been warm and pleasant all day.

Monday, June 6

Helped at washing and hunted bugs off the Niagara grape vines. It rained very hard this afternoon and it was almost a flood at Sapphire.

I went to the P.O. after supper. Received some colored views form Lamson's.

Tuesday, June. 7

Hiram and I went to Fairfield this forenoon and I stopped at Sapphire Inn and sold some views mostly the colored work. We were storm stayed at Burlingames on our way home. It rained pretty hard.

Wednesday, June 8

Hiram left for Brevard this morning. I was at Sapphire this forenoon and again tonight. I did considerable printing this afternoon.

Thursday, June 9

Printed and finished photos today.

Had Dave Miller hoeing in the orchard.

Been a very fine day.

Friday, June 10

Went over to Mrs. Hauckle's and tried some spinning and weaving photos. Took dinner there and then went to a fall on Thompson river and from there to the Rive's home near Rocky Knob. I got wet on my way home this evening.

Saturday, June 11

This was the 20th anniversary of our wedding. Kate had a good dinner to celebrate. We planned to go to some waterfall, but the forenoon was so misty we gave it up. I did some developing and took a photo of Dewey. We went up on the hill this evening and the view was grand. Dewey went over to Sapphire with me.

Sunday, June 12

Been a cool but fine day.

Monday, June 13

Thursday, June 23

Been a very nice day. I went up to the Fairfield Inn and took a bunch of photo views to be on sale there. Did a lot of printing this afternoon. Kate began her Lamson lessons in photo painting and did well, I thought.

Friday, June 24

Fine day.

Finished large number of photos.

Nellie went after the mail this afternoon.

Saturday, June 25

Another lovely summer day.

I wrote business letters and fixed up photos.

Went over to Sapphire this afternoon to send off orders and get the mail.

Sunday, June 26

Warm, fine day.

Have rested, read and wrote all day. We had our last strawberries for this season but the raspberries are ripening, so we will have plenty of fruit.

Monday, June 27

Ther.: 82+

Been pretty hot all day.

We had a shower at noon.

Dave finished mowing the orchard.

Went to the P.O. this afternoon to mail our letters.

Tuesday, June 28

Been cloudy most of the day and rained quite hard at times.

Went to Dave Miller's today noon and made a group photo for them.

There was a beautiful view off to the south this evening and we all went up in the orchard to see it.

Wednesday, June 29

Went over to Sapphire and up to Fairfield this afternoon. There was a heavy shower at home but not much where I was.

I received a lot more colored views from the Lamson Studios.

Thursday, June 30

No storm today. Had Arthur and Dave Miller all day and we built a porch on the back of the house and it will be a great convenience.

Friday, July 1

I did some more work on the view porch today fixing steps and making a screen door. Went to Sapphire for the mail this afternoon.

Saturday, July 2

Finished a batch of photos today. Did a little hoeing of tomato plants up on the hill this evening. It is cool tonight.

Sunday, July 3

Been a pleasant and cool day.

Mr. Burlingame called here this forenoon.

Monday, July 4

We did the washing this morning, had an early dinner, and then we all went over and had a boat ride on Lake Sapphire. I went up to the Fairfield Inn to take some photos. We called at the new Backers Cottage and at Armstrongs.

Wednesday, July 13

Kate went up on Mt. Toxaway with Mrs. Burlingame today. She took a lot of views up for Mrs. Crisp to sell. I did considerable printing.

Hoed the pop corn this evening.

Thursday, July 14

I went to Lake Toxaway today to take down photo views. There was a big excursion came there from Asheville.

It has been a fine day.

Friday, July 15

Worked at printing most all day.

Helped Kate pick berries this evening.

Mr. Burlingame brought over our 1/2 barrel graham flour from the store. I got a nice lot of huckleberries tonight.

Saturday, July 16

Got ready to go to Sapphire this afternoon to make some portraits and Kate was going along to take some berries to give different people, but there came up a rain and stopped us. I went over this evening and got the mail.

Sunday, July 17

We had a nice shower today.

Wrote, read and rested.

We have raspberries, huckleberries, and peaches now.

Monday, July 18

Picked more peaches this morning for Kate to can. They are going to ripen up very fast. I did some spraying but my vineyard of Niagara and Brighton are rotting fast. I went to Sapphire and Fairfield this afternoon.

Tuesday, July 19

Finished photos today.

Kate and Dewey went to Burgesses this afternoon where Kate had a tooth filled by a dentist who is stopping there.

It has been pretty hot all day.

Wednesday, July 20

I had to go over and have the dentist fix my plate so it would fit my mouth. Picked more peaches. Finished a large batch of photos this afternoon. Rain came near but did not get quite to us.

Thursday, July 21

Worked at fixing photos for market all the forenoon.

Went over to Sapphire and up to Fairfield this afternoon. There was quite a shower this afternoon.

Friday, July 22

Went to Lake Toxaway today riding down with Mr. Burgess this forenoon and walking back this evening. I took a lot of photos down to the Inn. Was in a little shower as I started for home.

Saturday, July 23

We had a heavy shower this forenoon. I finished a large batch of photos today.

We have peaches to eat right along.

Friday, July 29

We had a heavy shower just afternoon.

Went to Sapphire and Fairfield this afternoon to see after the picture business.

Saturday, July 30

Been a warm muggy day and tonight it rains.

I went over to Sapphire this afternoon for the mail.

Sunday, July 31

There was a very heavy rain storm a little after noon.

I called at Burlingames to meet Nellie on her way home from Sunday School. It is drizzling tonight.

Monday, August 1

I went to Lake Toxaway today, riding Dave Miller's horse. I settled at the Inn for the views sold there and got my check. It rained for quite a long time in the middle of the day, but I reached home all dry.

Tuesday, Aug. 2

Dave Miller helped me this forenoon and we fixed up some hitching places out in the park. Then we cleared the trail to the Glen and began work at cleaning up the building site on the hill. Went to Sapphire for the mail this afternoon. There was a sharp little shower this evening.

Wednesday, Aug. 3

This day passed without a storm, only a slight sprinkle at one time. Did a whole lot of printing today. Worked some on the road and trail so they are easier to travel. The Mamie Ross peach is now getting ripe.

Thursday, Aug. 4

Rained again today about noon.

I finished a very large batch of photos.

Friday, Aug. 5

Finished a large batch of photos today. There was one sharp little shower this afternoon.

Thursday, Aug. 18

This forenoon I went to make a photo of a cottage just built on the shore of Sapphire lake by Mr. Backus of New York. It has not rained today or even thundered.

Friday, Aug. 19

A number of showers during today.

I was at Fairfield about all day. Made a group photo for the darky waiters at the Inn. Had dinner at "Bong" Whitmire's and tried a photo of their baby.

Saturday, Aug. 20

No rain today.

I walked to Lake Toxaway this morning going by Sapphire.

It has been pretty warm all day.

Sunday, Aug. 21

Been a very nice day. Had a good rest. We had a call this afternoon from Mr. Backus and ladies from the Inn. We showed them some of the beauties of our place.

Monday, Aug. 22

I built a shelter over the cellar way today. Mrs. Jacobs and Roy were here at dinner and spent the afternoon.

Miss Rebecca Jennings and Miss Stevenson were here about noon.

The day has been very busy for Kate and I.

Tuesday, Aug. 23

Pleasant this morning but came onto rain and stormed good part of the day. Mrs. Dr. Cheatham drove up and visited with Kate.

Wednesday, Aug. 24

Not much sun today but I did a good lot of printing.

Went to Sapphire for the mail this afternoon.

It rains tonight.

Thursday, Aug. 25

Finished photos today.

Kate went over to Dr. Grimshawe's this forenoon, riding Dave's horse.

Friday, Aug. 26

I went to Fairfield today to take up photos. There was a storm at noon and lightning heavily shocked some people in the Sapphire store.

It has been drizzling all the afternoon.

Saturday, Aug. 27

I was a little sick last night and today, so could not got to Burlingames to dinner but Kate and the children went over for a call this afternoon.

It has been a very nice day.

Monday, Aug. 29

We did the washing this morning. This afternoon I went to Mt. Toxaway and Kate, Nellie and Dewey went to The Narrows. It has been another fine day.

Tuesday, Aug. 30

Did some printing today, but the clouds and a little sprinkle this afternoon put a stop to my work. Kate, Dewey, Mrs. D. Miller and little Scadin went down to the Twin Falls this forenoon. I picked some very fine peaches today, and the last of our plums.

Wednesday, Aug. 31

I began to finish a batch of photos about noon, when I was taken suddenly sick. Dr. Cheatham came to see me this afternoon and said I had an attack like cholera morbus. Kate finished the batch of photos and got them out all right. Mrs. Burlingame and the boys were here to dinner. Mr. and Mrs. Phillips called to see me. Dave was working and so could help in our trouble.

Thursday, September 1

I have been able to get about considerable today, though rather weak. I got a basket full of fine fruit from the orchard this forenoon. Also a fine muskmelon which we had at dinner. It has been showering considerable this afternoon. Dave went over and got my mail this afternoon. Kate is hard at the packing.

Friday, Sept. 2

Mr. Neely left the country this morning to start for his old home in Nova Scotia. It has been a fine day.

I have not worked much, but feel that I am improving.

Saturday, Sept. 3

We got up early this morning and did a washing then Kate, Dewey and I had Dave Miller's horse and buggy and drove to Fairfield. We had nice weather for the trip. I walked to Sapphire tonight to get a camera I had sent from Lake Toxaway.

Sunday, Sept. 4

We had a heavy rainstorm today. We read and took our naps. Mr. and Mrs. Dave Miller and Mr. and Mrs. Burlingame called on us. It cleared up some toward night.

Monday, Sept. 5

Did washing early this morning then I went to Sapphire with mail. Did more packing and getting ready to move.

Tuesday, Sept. 6

Thad Miller came after the organ this morning. We finished packing boxes and barrels and crated the sewing machine. Kate packed the trunks and all are about ready for the start tomorrow.

Wednesday, Sept. 7

We had a busy morning getting ready to leave. We had dinner with the Jacobs at Lake Toxaway and this afternoon came to Hendersonville, where I said good bye to Kate, Dewey and Nellie and came on down to Tryon. I am stopping at Mr. Howes.

Thursday, Sept. 8

I went over town this morning and talked with Kate at Hendersonville over the phone. Just after dinner I had to photograph the bride and groom and her attendants, and also the church interior after the ceremony. It has been a fine day. Suppose Kate and the children are on the road somewhere in Tennessee.

Friday, Sept. 9

Went to get a photo of a little shoal on Vaughua creek this forenoon. This afternoon I went down the Pacolet River to Lynn and then back to Tryon. It has seemed warm to me, but has been a pleasant day.

Saturday, Sept. 10

Thursday, Sept. 15

Went up to Fairfield this forenoon and settled my business there. Took dinner with Ed. Raines at Sapphire Inn. Did a lot of developing tonight. Cool and clear. Had a letter from Kate this afternoon.

Friday, Sept. 16

Went to Dr. Grimshawe's this forenoon and then on to the Rocky Knob country. Took a sack of things for Katie Revis that Kate had fixed up for her.

Made graham Gems and warmed up potato for supper.

Saturday, Sept. 17

I did retouching and printing till about 3 o'clock this afternoon when I went to Sapphire and Fairfield taking some grapes to give away. Had letters from Kate and ma. It has been a beautiful day.

Sunday, Sept. 18

43 years old today. I went to Burgesses and Nicholsons' this forenoon to make group photos that I have promised for a long time. Mr. Burlingame and Dave were here a while this afternoon.

Monday, Sept. 19

Finished photos today. Had callers from the Inn about noon. It has clouded up tonight.

Tuesday, Sept. 20

Did up the photos to send Conners at Tryon this morning. Went over to Sapphire with them then went on up the mountain to the Lodge and settled up with Mrs. Crisp. Brought a basket home and picked some grapes for her. Had a letter from Kate and she and Dewey have colds.

Wednesday, Sept. 21

Fixed up a lot more mail this morning and took over to the office. Took down my exhibit at Sapphire Inn and brought away all samples. There was a good shower this afternoon, the first in some time.

Thursday, Sept. 22

Went to Sapphire twice today. Had letter from Kate and ma and a new pocketbook from Kate for my last birthday. A Mr. Hanier from New Castle, Pa. took dinner with me and I showed him over the place. It rained during last night and was cloudy and cool today.

Friday, Sept. 23

Been a nice bright day. I went to Dr. Grimshawes this forenoon and made him some views of his house. This afternoon I dug the rest of the potatoes and picked a bushel of grapes.

Saturday, Sept. 24

I got around early this morning and walked down to Lake Toxaway, where I settled up at the Inn for the season. Walked back this afternoon by Sapphire to get my mail. Took dinner at the Jacobs and supper at Burlingames. Been a fine day.

Sunday, Sept. 25

I was over at Burgesses a little while this morning. Have written a lot of letters today.

Ate a great many grapes, probably more than was good for me.

The weather is superb.

Monday, Sept. 26

Did some printing today there was a shower at noon but it cleared off beautifully. I went to Sapphire for the mail this afternoon, taking a basket of grapes to Mr. Ben Alexander, who is recovering from a severe fit of sickness. Had a letter from Kate and they have had frosts and cold weather.

Tuesday, Sept. 27

Did some more printing today.

Roxy Alexander came to have her photo taken, and Lucy Burlingame came with her. I treated them to grapes.

Took letters and started for town but Mr. B. said he would go in morning, so spent evening ther. It has been at summer heat.

Wednesday, Sept. 28

Warm day and thunder about this afternoon. I finished a batch of photos. Did up a lot of them to send by mail but am too tired to go over town tonight.

Thursday, Sept. 29

Another almost hot day. I went up to Fairfield this forenoon to make a couple of portrait photos and also got some views. Took dinner with Mr. and Mrs. Philips at the Sapphire Inn. They start for New York Saturday. Went to Sapphire again this afternoon for mail and to get photo of Borgson children. Had letter from kate.

Friday, Sept. 30

Tapped my walking shoes this morning and got things in shape for a tramp. There came one sharp little sprinkle that made me think I could not go, but this afternoon was beautiful and I walked through to Whiteside Cove.

Saturday, October 1

Spent the day in making views about and interiors of the Grimshawes house. It was cloudy during the middle of the day. Have been reading the "School of the Woods" and must get the book for Kate to read to Dewey.

Sunday, Oct. 2

Mr. Grimshawe took me up the cliff trail on Whiteside so I could see the wonderful rocks. We had our lunch about 1 o'clock, then he went back home and I came on over to Highlands. Douglas Chandler and sister came up on Whiteside Mt. It has been a beautiful day. Am stopping at Smiths.

Monday, Oct. 3

This morning I went down below Satulah to get a views of the mountain, then I went on the summit and so back to town. This afternoon I went on the mountain again. The atmosphere was very clear all day and I hope I got some nice photos. Called up at Ravenels to get a view of Horse Cove. Made a few friendly calls this evening. The nights are cool.

Tuesday, Oct. 4

Came home from Highlands today. It was cloudy most of the day. I stopped a little while at Whiteside Cove. Found things all quiet at home. Did some developing tonight, and wrote a letter to Kate.

Wednesday, Oct. 5

Did some writing this morning then went to Sapphire for my mail. Had a short letter from Kate and she had received the freight.

I did considerable printing this afternoon. Finished developing tonight.

Thursday, Oct. 6

Did more printing today. Started picking apples this afternoon but a heavy shower stopped me. There was thunder and considerable hail. I went to Sapphire for the mail and took some grapes for the Inn manager and a box of them for Mr. Ravenel. Had a letter from Kate and Dewey was going to school. Had supper at Burlingames.

Friday, Oct. 7

It rained during last night and had turned real cool this morning. Has been cool and cloudy all day. I did more printing and think I am about through. Picked a lot of apples toward evening.

Saturday, Oct. 8

It cleared up this forenoon and has been a fine day. I finished picking all the apples and calculate I have nearly 6 bushels. Took my washing over to Burgesses after dinner, then went to Sapphire after the mail. Hold a letter from ma.

Sunday, Oct. 9

I took a turn about among the Millers this forenoon but the men were all away. Mr. Burlingame called on me this afternoon, also Arthur Miller toward night. It has been a fine day.

Monday, Oct. 10

I finished a big batch of photos today. Had Dave mowing weeds in the orchard.

Went to Sapphire toward evening to get my mail.

Been a beautiful day.

Tuesday, Oct. 11

Very busy all the forenoon fixing up photos to deliver or send away. Went to Sapphire this afternoon.

Hiram came tonight and we had a good visit.

The weather is very mild.

Wednesday, Oct. 12

Nice day. Hiram and I walked over Rainy Knob to look at the orchards. This afternoon I rode a mule up to Fairfield to deliver some photos and make some collections. Hiram had Dave and put up his tent at Sapphire.

Tonight he cooked a soup and I made gems.

Thursday, Oct. 13

Spent the day in sorting, packing and putting away my negatives. It was a job.

Hiram was at Sapphire, where he did some portrait work. It is quite cool tonight.

Friday, Oct. 14

Continued my packing of photo tools and stock and have not finished yet. I went to Sapphire with Hiram today noon. He started for Cashiers Valley with his tent. I received letters from Kate and ma. Fine day.

I still have some nice grapes to eat.

Saturday, Oct. 15

We fixed the front gate this forenoon making it to swing and latch. Took out the little gate entirely. Did a little more packing this afternoon and mailed up two boxes. Went to Sapphire toward evening to take my stock of Sapphire views to Ed. T. Raines to be sold at the store. There was frost this morning for the first and it is real cool tonight.

Sunday, Oct. 16

Considerable frost this morning. I went to Dr. Grimshawes this forenoon to get some medicine to take home. Took dinner with Dave and his folks. Spent most of the afternoon looking over and putting away things. Took supper at the Burlingames.

Monday, Oct. 17

Got my packing almost done up today. I am getting tired of it too.

This evening I went over to Sapphire and had supper with the manager of the Sapphire Inn and his family. Enjoyed it very much. Had a letter from Kate which will be the last I expect.

Good frost this morning.

Tuesday, Oct. 18

Finished packing and boxing this forenoon and this afternoon I cleaned up the shop and put things in shape to leave. Dave railed up the raspberry bushes. I packed and roped up my trunk tonight. One more day to stay in the little mountain home. Continues lovely weather.

Wednesday, Oct. 19

Been very busy putting things in shape in the house. Made some gems from graham flour and corm meal for my lunch box. I went over to Sapphire right after dinner and said good bye to the folks there. Had supper at Burlingames and spent most of the evening. Put up my lunch and packed my valise tonight. Mr. Burgess took my trunk and freight to the depot.

Thursday, Oct. 20

Got out of bed at 4 o'clock this morning so as to get things ready to start early. Mrs. Miller took me to Lake Toxaway, where I took train and came to Brevard where I am staying tonight. There have been clouds today. I came off and left my box of lunch and box of show fruit on the table at home. Had a nice visit with Dr. and Mrs. Cheatham tonight.

Friday, Oct. 21

I left Brevard this forenoon and came on north. Had to wait a while at Asheville then got train to Knoxville where I got my Cincinnati sleeper. It has cleared off without rain.

Saturday, Oct. 22

Got into Cincinnati too late for the morning train north and had to stay till 1 this afternoon when I got a fine train to Toledo. Got to Detroit in time for late train to Dexter and Will was there. They had moved today and Kate was at their house waiting for me. We drove out home by moonlight. All seem well. It is freezing tonight.

Sunday, Oct. 23

Been rather chilly all day. The folks all went to Sunday School but me. Dor and Nellie came down to dinner and Will and Millicent drove down for a call. Horace Sayles came up from John Williams for a call tonight.

Monday, Oct. 24

It has been cool and very windy all day. I drove up town for my baggage and to buy some clothing to work in. found things in my trunk and valise all right. Helped John Cushing draw up some stalks this afternoon. This evening I have talked with several old friends over the new telephone.

Tuesday, Oct. 25

Called at Balls this forenoon. Saw Ralph Williams cutting corn with a corn binder. This afternoon John Cushing and I drew some gravel onto the road. Kate and I called on Maude Williams tonight.

Wednesday, Oct. 26

We finished the gravel drawing this morning. Picked some apples to put in the cellar.

This afternoon it has tried to snow squall and has been disagreeable.

Thursday, Oct. 27

Did some cleaning up about the wood house this forenoon. It was real cold today, but quite pleasant.

I went to Dexter this afternoon and got our clock. John Bird had the team to go to Ann Arbor.

Friday, Oct. 28

Hoed grass and weeds away from the young fruit trees this forenoon. Got up a load of wood this afternoon. It has been a pleasant day. The ladies packed a missionary barrel here.

Saturday, Oct. 29

I drew a couple of loads of block wood this forenoon. Picked some more apples this afternoon. John Cushing went to Ann Arbor on the train. Kate, John and I were down at Maude Williams' tonight.

Sunday, Oct. 30

Another nice day.

Read and loafed all day.

Henry Queal and wife called on us just a little while this evening. Nellie stayed with us last night but went back to Don's today.

Monday, Oct. 31

Ther.: 26+

Froze quite hard last night. Helped wash, picked a few apples, mailed up the missionary barrel and got apples and potatoes put up for Will, which I took to Dexter this afternoon. The roads are very smooth and nice. John Cushing went up town with me.

Tuesday, November 1

I picked a few more apples this forenoon and put in the cellar. This afternoon I drew a load of wheat over to Delhi and sold it. It has been a very pleasant day. Dewey telephoned his uncle Henry in Humbert tonight.

Wednesday, Nov. 2

Drew two loads of wheat to Delhi today and that took all of ma's wheat. I am to draw Will's tomorrow or all I can of it. It looks a little like a storm gathering.

Thursday, Nov. 3

Clear and dry again today. I hauled Will's wheat off to Delhi and got a check for \$98 for him.

In coming back on my trips I have brought in all the block wood over south.

Friday, Nov. 4

We killed 9 chickens this morning and Kate and I took them to Ann Arbor and sold them. Kate and I did considerable shopping buying a desk for Dewey and two chairs for me. We had our dinner at a restaurant. We called on the Prices this afternoon. I got some photo supplies. Been a nice day.

Saturday, Nov. 5

Kate, ma, Dewey and John Cushing went to a farmers club meeting at Valentines today, and I had my dinner alone. I took some more apples into the cellar as it has grown cold fast. Made a railing on the north porch to keep folks from falling off. Nellie came over this afternoon and is staying tonight. We made an evening call at aunt Dehlia Kenney's.

Sunday, Nov. 6

Ther.: 26+

Pretty well frozen up this morning. It has been a bright day. We all went to church this forenoon. The services were carried on by a couple of young fellows from Ann Arbor. They had dinner with us. Will came down from Dexter this afternoon and I took him most home tonight.

Monday, Nov. 7

Hauled up 153 bushels of corn today. It has looked stormy all day. The furniture and dishes we bought in Ann Arbor were brought out to us today. Miss Haab came today to so serving for Kate.

Tuesday, Nov. 8

Election today, but as I could not vote I am not so interested as usual. Kate went to Dexter this afternoon and John Cushing went up to take the train for Ann Arbor. I sorted corn this afternoon. Had to milk the cow tonight, the first time since I came home.

Wednesday, Nov. 9

Husked corn considerable today. It has been a fine day. John came home this forenoon. We heard by telephone that the republicans won heavily in election yesterday.

Thursday, Nov. 10

A little flurry of snow early this morning. It has been raw and windy all day. Drew all the corn from the little field today. Nettie West was here this afternoon and evening.

Friday, Nov. 11

Ther.: 22+

Went to Dexter this forenoon to get my freight from N.C. This afternoon I have been unpacking the things.

It was cold this morning and all day but the sun was quite bright.

Saturday, Nov. 12

Been at work most of the day on a table and shelves for use in photo work.

It has been very windy and dusty. Kate went to Dexter this forenoon and took Miss Haab home tonight. John went to Ann Arbor.

Sunday, Nov. 13

Another windy, chilly day. Lawrence Queal came and spent the day with us and is staying tonight.

Ma and Kate attended church and Dewey and I stayed home.

John Cushing came home at noon.

Monday, Nov. 14

Been quite a pleasant day. I helped Kate wash this forenoon, and put up the shelves for negatives above my work table.

I went to Delhi tonight to meet Nettie West at the train.

Tuesday, Nov. 15

Been a beautiful day. The beans were threshed today and ma had 31 bushels. I did some more about getting my photo things in shape for work.

Wednesday, Nov. 16

I did some printing on platinum paper today to get some prints for Kate to paint on. Ma, Kate and Nettie West went to Dexter this afternoon.

John and I drew up another load of corn.

It is milder weather.

Thursday, Nov. 17

Drew the corn stalks from the little field today and also a load of corn.

Friday, Nov. 18

Been an elegant day and quite warm.

An oyster supper was held here tonight for the benefit of the church and we were busy all day getting in shape for it. There was nearly 100 persons present, and the night was perfect for it.

Saturday, Nov. 19

John and I put in most of the day drawing stalks from the south field. We are both a little tired tonight. There was a chunk of ice left from last night and we froze some ice cream tonight.

Sunday, Nov. 20

It was fairly pleasant this forenoon but got to raining some this afternoon. Will was down from Dexter and we took a walk over the farm and talked over matters relating to the old farm. We had frozen sherbet for dinner and lunch tonight.

Monday, Nov. 21

Helped washed this forenoon then drew Osbert Williams buzz saw and jack home. It had been in our wood shed since Will had it last year. This afternoon Kate, Ma and Nettie went to Dexter and I pruned grape vines. It has been a pleasant day.

Tuesday, Nov. 22

Kate and I took dinner at aunt Delia Kenny's today. Mr. and Mrs. Bennett, Mrs. Walked and Bert Kenny and wife were there too. Tonight we went over to Don's and had supper, taking Dewey along. John and I got a load of corn and a load of stalks.

Wednesday, Nov. 23

Been another beautiful day. Kate went to Dexter and had some teeth filled. John and I piled up some lumber in a shed. This afternoon we hauled up some corn and stalks. Tonight it is growing cloudy.

Thursday, Nov. 24

Thanksgiving day. I went over to Don's this forenoon to try fixing Nellie's organ but could not. Don and Nellie came and took dinner with us. Been some cloudy today.

Friday, Nov. 25

Very pleasant this forenoon, but clouded up and grew chilly this afternoon. Tonight it seems like snow. I made some platinum prints today and John and I got all the remaining corn and stalks in. Kate and Dewey went to Dexter this forenoon and Kate went again tonight to take Nettie West to the train for Jackson.

Saturday, Nov. 26

Winter came today with a fierce snow squall and colder weather. Spent most of my time in choring about and working up wood.

Kate painted several prints and I put them in new folders I just got.

Sunday, Nov. 27

Ther.: 22

We planned to go out to Henry Queal's today, but it was so late when S.S. was out we gave it up. It is growing cold.

Monday, Nov. 28

Ther.: 12+, 32+

Pretty cold this morning. Helped wash and then John and I drew some chaff out on his place. I went to Dexter this afternoon and had Joe shod. It was late when I got home. The wind blows great guns tonight and is disagreeable to be out in.

Tuesday, Nov. 29

Not very pleasant today, but less disagreeable than yesterday. I have not felt very well, seem to have a cold. Split some wood and chored about.

Wednesday, Nov. 30

Been snow squally today.

I put ashes about all the young apple trees this forenoon. This afternoon John and I began on making some horse stalls in the barn basement. It is growing cold tonight.

Thursday, December 1

The folks went to a missionary dinner and meeting at Mrs. Kenny's today. John went after Millicent this morning and I took her home tonight. I made some platinum prints in spite of dull weather.

Friday, Dec. 2

This has been a winter day in earnest. Snowing and blowing all day. John and I cut an old, dying apple tree by the granery, to work up into firewood.

Saturday, Dec. 3

Kate finished some painting of photos for Tryon and I sent them off by mail today. This has been a pleasant winter day.

We finished working up the apple tree and burned the brush.

Sunday, Dec. 4

Just a fair sort of winter day.

I did some writing of letters and reading of papers. Mr. Stocking who spoke at the church today took dinner here. John went to Dexter this afternoon and is not coming back for a day or two.

Monday, Dec. 5

Not very cold today. John Bird drew a load of wood up to Will this forenoon.

Kate and ma went to Dexter this afternoon. I spent the day in choring about. Dewey is much interested in drawing with colored pencils tonight.

Tuesday, Dec. 6
Ther.: 12+

A clear, sunny day, and I did some printing on Aristo paper. As John is not home yet it keeps me most of my time doing chores. It has clouded up tonight.

Wednesday, Dec. 7

I have been making platinum prints, for Kate to paint. Dr. Blair and a friend came here and went hunting in the swamp. John came home tonight.

I found a new calf at the barn tonight.

Been cloudy all day.

Thursday, Dec. 8

Colder wind today but considerable sunshine. I went to Ann Arbor on the cars to get some photo things. Came back to Dexter and walked home.

Friday, Dec. 9

Did writing of letters and doing up of photos to send by mail this forenoon. Cut down another large old apple tree this afternoon.

Keeps me pretty busy doing chores.

It was cold this morning.

Saturday, Dec. 10
Ther.: 16+

We all went to a farmers club meeting at Edwin Balls today. We took Maude Williams and aunt Em. I met a number of old friends that I had not seen since coming back. It seems pretty sharply cold tonight.

Sunday, Dec. 11

A little fine half snow all day and tonight settling down to a good storm from the east. Will came down on a wheel and spent most of the day with us. Kate has had a headache about all day. Dewey wrote a small letter to the Burlingame boys.

Monday, Dec. 12

Snowed all day so there is about 4 inches on the ground and it looks very wintry. John went to Ann Arbor this afternoon.

Tuesday, Dec. 13
Ther.: 1+, 6+

Cold this morning. Spent most of the day doing chores. John came back tonight.

Wednesday, Dec. 14
Ther.: 4-, 20+

Bitterly cold this morning.

Kate and I went to Dexter this afternoon to do some Christmas trading. We called on uncle John and aunt Ann. I don't like such wintry weather.

Thursday, Dec. 15

It grew warmer today and was comfortable to work.

I went down and walked over the north woods and some of the swamp this forenoon.

Tonight Kate, John Cushing and I went to a grange oyster supper at Crouch's on the old Boyden place. It was an enjoyable affair.

Friday, Dec. 16

Ther.: 14+, 16+

Kate and I went to Ann Arbor to do our Christmas trading.

We had dinner at George Phelps.

I got a new overcoat and Kate a new cloak.

Saturday, Dec. 17

Ther.: 10+

Worked about home choring all day. There was a little snow storm this morning, then it grew warm but tonight it has grown cold.

Sunday, Dec. 18

Ther.: 15+

Milder today, but a chilly south-west wind. It seems like snow tonight.

Went to church this forenoon.

Monday, Dec. 19

Mild winter weather today. We sent off some pictures for Christmas presents, and I wrote several letters.

Kate and I spent the evening at Ralph Williams. Frank and his wife were there on a visit.

Frank Preston killed a beef for us this forenoon.

Tuesday, Dec. 20

This has been a wild and blizzardy day. It snowed and the wind was very high. I could do but little but chores today. Bert Kenny bought a quarter of the beef and Ralph Williams spoke for one. John Bird took wood up to Dexter for Will.

Wednesday, Dec. 21

Ther.: 18+, 22+

Had John Bird today and we sawed wood in the north woods. It has been quite a pleasant day. Kate went over and helped Nellie do some washing.

Thursday, Dec. 22
Ther.: 40+

It warmed up today and is thawing.

I drew up some wood on the sleigh but the snow is fast melting.

Friday, Dec. 23

Had a busy day. Did the chores alone as John is away. Went to Dexter and took up some corn and oats and had ground for feed. Did a lot of errands. Stopped at aunt Ann's and she had oysters for me to eat. It was real warm all day and there was some rain tonight, but it is growing cooler.

Saturday, Dec. 24

Been getting things ready for Christmas. Tonight the exercises were held at the church and all the children spoke and sung and had a great time. We all had a plenty of presents. Dewey is proud over a sled. Kate had a private tree for him at home.

Sunday, Dec. 25

Will stayed here last night. He went to McColls for dinner and he, Millicent, and Ray came here for a short stay this evening. Don and Nellie had dinner with us. It has been cloudy and looks like snowing. Kate and I called at Williams tonight and Maude tried here new crutches.

Monday, Dec. 26

Foggy all day and tonight it is raining quite hard. We got a nice box from Ralph and Lizzie today. Guess our Christmas is all in now and we ought to be satisfied.

Tuesday, Dec. 27
Ther.: 52+, 20+

It rained all last night and a good share of today. It was real warm at 3 o'clock this afternoon, but turned cold rapidly tonight. I did chores and sawed and split a little wood.

Wednesday, Dec. 28
Ther.: 10+, 18+

A sort of Blizzard most all day.

I fixed the basement so I put the horses in there tonight. One of my ribs seems to be cracked and hurts me when I move.

Thursday, Dec. 29
Ther.: 10+, 24+

Mother and Kate went to a Missionary meeting at Mrs. Sears' today, taking Maude Williams with them. It has been a fairly good winter day. Dewey stayed and helped me care for things at home.

Friday, Dec. 30
Ther.: 40+

I did some platinum printing today. Kate and ma went to Dexter and spent most of the day. Dewey and I ran business at home. It has been warming up and was a pleasant day.

Saturday, Dec. 31
Ther.: 48+

This morning we heard by telegram that the beautiful High School building at Ann Arbor burned. Most of the people saw the flames. It has been warm all day and sun shone quite bright. I did some work on horse stalls so the stalls are all right now. Kate and I went to a social gathering at Mr. Shull's tonight. John Cushing came home tonight.
